OPENING CEREMONY - conducted by Mrs. Gerien. On motion by Mr. Gianino, seconded by Mrs. Waldron, the Board voted unanimously to convene in Executive Session to discuss Particular Personnel, Negotiations and Litigation.

At 8:08 p.m. Mr. Rossi moved, Mr. Raustiala seconded, and the Board reconvened the Regular Meeting.

Mrs. Gerien announced that this evening the Board would be accepting Mrs. Elias' letter of resignation as Superintendent of Schools. On behalf of the Board, Mrs. Gerien thanked Mrs. Elias for all of her years of service and especially this past year as Superintendent. Where we have come in twelve months is amazing and the way Mrs. Elias has lead and shepherded this District has been amazing. The Board and the community thank you very much for your time with us as a teacher, as an administrator and as the Superintendent.

Mrs. Gerien announced that she was very pleased, on behalf of the Board of Education, to announce that the Board would be unanimously appointing Mr. Ed Ehmann as our next Superintendent of Schools this evening.

COMMUNICATIONS

Section A - Correspondence - The following correspondence was presented for the Board's review.

1. Letter to Members of the Board of Education from Parents of 2007-08 third grade students at St. James Elementary School regarding class size.

Discussion – Mrs. Waldron asked the administration to review how the District deals with elementary class size over the summer months. Mr. Ehmann explained that the District monitors the student population in all of the elementary schools in each and every grade. Class enrollment does change from day-to-day or week-to-week. We monitor this carefully and we do not break sections until the latter part of the summer because once we break a section and there is a change in population we cannot reverse what we have done. Right now we are monitoring class sections in Accomsett, Branch Brook, Nesconset, St. James and Tackan. As these numbers unfold we will be in touch with the principals so that they will find out what we are going to do with a particular section. We know that there are a number of parents who are concerned about their children's class size. Understand that this Board has instituted a practice of an average of twenty-five students in K-2 and twenty-seven students in grades 3-5. We try to uphold that across the board. Every once in a while a class will get a 28th child. Some schools may not have the classroom space to open another section so an aide is put in that class. For those parents who are concerned, we will stay in touch with the principal of your building and will monitor this. We won't be doing anything definitive until August.

Mr. Rossi asked if there was a school with eighty second graders in four sections, would it be the District's practice to eliminate one section for that same group in third grade. Mr. Ehmann responded, yes, because the practice is an average of twenty-seven students in grades 3-5.

Mrs. Waldron asked how many teachers the District currently has in the bank Mr. Ehmann responded that the population of fifth graders was large last year. Due to their move to the middle school we have 3.5 unassigned FTE's right now that were in the budget and there was 1.0 that we put in the bank specifically in case it was needed; therefore we are at 4.5 FTE. Mrs. Waldron asked if in the future we could look to cut class size in a district-wide way. Mr. Ehmann responded, yes, that is something that we will be trying to do.

Mr. Gianino read a portion of Policy 4420 ... "At the elementary level, where practicable, grades K-5 shall not exceed 25 students. Individual exceptions may be made at the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, with consultation and approval of the Board." He then questioned the previous statements regarding K-2. Mrs. Elias responded that Policy states "where practicable" so it is not written in stone. For years the Board has done that. Two years ago unfortunately Mt. Pleasant had thirty-one in the third grade because of the influx. So that is "where practicable". Three years ago this community worked hard and many people said we don't want any more thirty-student elementary classes. We had decided three years ago twenty-five K-2 and twenty-seven 3-5 and that is how we have scheduled. Even in negotiations, the STA wanted a definitive number and we have never supported that because there are aberrations; that is why that number is there. It is as you quoted "wherever practicable". Mrs. Cahill stated that the number of twenty-seven came about from the contingent year. Two Superintendents ago there was an effort to do twenty-five K-5 and we were approaching that. The year we went on contingency that changed. Coming out of contingency the direction that the district was given by the Board of Education at the time was to use twenty-seven in grades three, four and five because it yielded a significant savings in the development of the budget. This year when we developed the budget those same guidelines were used. Mr. Gianino referenced the STA contract, in Appendix D it says the same thing that at the elementary level, where possible, Grades K-3rd shall not exceed twenty-five students in a class and Grades 4th-5th shall not exceed thirty students by the opening of school. Mr. Gianino suggested that these items be consistent.

Mr. Saggese questioned the number of teachers in the bank. Mr. Ehmann made clear the difference between scheduling elementary and high school students. Mr. Ehmann stated that if we were to break an elementary section in June we would probably regret it in August. Although the parents are concerned, and rightfully so, it is too early for us to commit FTE's. If there is an influx of population and we break open some of these sections on the cusp, and then we get kids in kindergarten and we have to break sections for them, we are going to be coming back to you for many more FTE's than you budgeted for. Mr. Saggese stated that the fifth grade class was one of the largest in the district and they moved on to the middle school so that relieves some of the pressure on classes. He added that he would like to address the priority of K-5 before you try to put other classes back in. Mr. Ehmann agreed that was a perspective that a lot of people would share if their children were just in elementary school, but parents who have children at the high school are feeling a little frustrated because the current students weren't getting the opportunities that students three or four years ago were enjoying. We were trying to fix K-12, it is a huge district, it is hard to fix in one year. The numbers in elementary are in the ballpark where we would like to be; we have 3.5 or 4.5 FTE's in the bank which we will apply to address some of these issues. We just can't tell you tonight what issues they will be because it is too early.

MOTION by Mrs. Waldron, seconded by Mr. Raustiala that the correspondence in Section A, as listed above, be received and that the recommendations of the administration (where indicated) be accepted.

Mr. Gianino reported that the Policy Committee met last week to discuss the Interscholastic Athletic Policy regarding moving up exceptional athletes. From the meeting last week it appears that we have consensus on that. It is on the agenda for a first reading tonight.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Superintendent took this opportunity to reflect on her tenure in Smithtown as a classroom teacher, Director of Curriculum and Assistant Superintendent for Instruction; stating that she takes tremendous pride in being part of the cadre of professionals who educated the children of Smithtown. Mrs. Elias stated that as Superintendent of Smithtown she is honored to be at the helm of a well respected, high achieving, and excellent school district. Any success I may have a claim to is directly attributed to the dedicated, visionary, hard-working staff that always gives so generously of themselves for the betterment of educating our children. In retrospect, it was a very good year. Three contracts were settled, we had a highly effective and highly transparent budgetary process that yielded a tax rate that was the lowest in years and the community supported it with a resounding plurality of a thousand votes. We have also had a solid, good New York State Comptroller's Audit Report. Mrs. Elias thanked the Smithtown community for continually affirming their confidence in her ability to lead.

Updates – The Superintendent brought the Board up-to-date on the following items of interest:

- Smithtown High School East and High School West both observed their 92nd Annual Commencement Exercises simultaneously at the two campuses on Friday, June 22. The Honor Speakers were Christopher McKenna at High School West and Jonathan Jacobs at High School East. Senior Class Presentations were given by the two presidents – Leah Rotella at East and Kimberly Wisniewski at West.
- The three middle schools and nine elementary schools all had moving up ceremonies last week.
- The Nature Club at Tackan Elementary, under the supervision of teacher Tim Hellmuth, helped to plant two trees, a Pear and Dogwood, in memory of Arlene Icolari, a former Computer Lab Assistant, at Tackan.
- Katherine Berner, a junior at SHS West, has been accepted to the NYS Summer Young Writer's Institute. The program is run by SUNY Albany and Skidmore College and is funded by the NYS Legislature. Kate was one of 30 students accepted statewide.
- Students, faculty and staff recently gathered to celebrate the anniversary of Accomsett Elementary School's *First Fabulous Forty Years*. Students presented historic overviews of world events that highlighted the world and national news since the opening of the school in the 1966-1967 school year. The fifth grade students in Mrs. Frankel's class at Smithtown Elementary had the opportunity to create businesses of their own while participating in a real-life experience on becoming an entrepreneur. This proved to be a valuable and fun lesson which incorporated cooperative learning in math, economics and entrepreneurship.
- Mt. Pleasant Elementary School carried on their annual Flag Day tradition. Each year, the fourth grade students invite members of the Marine Corps to raise the flag in honor of Flag Day. Lance Corporal Mike Salemi and Lance Corporal Jason Weiss performed the flag raising ceremony and listened as students from each class recited their reasons why they are proud to be Americans.

Mr. Rossi concluded that he was happy with the Policy before this proposed revision.

INSTRUCTIONAL REPORT

Report on Film Festival

Mrs. Cahill stated that recently the District had hosted what has become known as The Film Festival. Our staff member, Tim Needles, has been very instrumental in making that project a real happening in Smithtown for the past two years. It is not an event that happens in our surrounding districts, it is pretty much a one of a kind. It draws students from our surrounding districts and states and other countries. Unfortunately Mr. Needles is out of town today and not able to attend this meeting. Mrs. Cahill introduced Ms. Stephanie Gress, curator of the Vanderbilt, and Mr. George Giokis, of Staffwriters Plus, both of whom have been with the film festival from its inception at the I.A.B. Ms. Gress and Mr. Giokis gave a brief description of the film festival which was followed by a showing of the winning documentary film by its maker, Jason Verdadero.

Section C - Audience - Mrs. Gerien welcomed the members of the audience and called speakers to the podium from the sign-in sheet.

BUSINESS AFFAIRS

Finance

Ms. Niles notified the Board that in response to the State Comptroller's Report the Special Ed. Department has sent letters out to all of these people that you see on the agenda for next year to request a quotation. We would probably not be doing a complete Request for Proposal; however, as a compromise requests for quotes were sent. The letter states that after evaluation of your proposal, and if it is acceptable to the school district, it will then be presented to the Board of Education for their approval for services to be provided for the 2007-2008 school year. We have done requests for quotations, they have all been reviewed. Although we haven't done a formal request for proposal we have followed up on the suggestions that were made and all of these people have been evaluated by the Special Education Department. This was done to assure the District that we are getting comparable proposals from comparable companies. We are such a large district that in most cases one provider can't handle it. As one example – all of the tutoring services are at the same rate. We are pleased to announce to the BOE that this was done.

MOTION by Mr. Raustiala, seconded by Mrs. Waldron approving Finance Items 1 – 33 on a consent motion

Discussion: Mrs. Waldron made mention of the septic tank at Branch Brook Elementary School and asked the attorney to make sure that we have covered all of our avenues from the Town, the County, the State and Mobil-Exxon. Mrs. Waldron stated that before we spend that money she wants to make sure that we would be able to recoup it if that is the case. Mr. Albert responded that spending the money on it is a necessity and there still is the possibility of going after – or taking legal action – against a municipal entity if it can be shown that they dropped the ball or didn't do what they were supposed to do with respect to either dredging or proper maintenance on any of the groundwater – improper cleanup, improper supervision of that process. That still remains to be seen, but by spending the money now that would not preclude us from trying to recoup the money at a later date.

Mr. Saggese asked for explanation of #4 – funding of various reserves. Ms. Niles responded that before June 30th the Board must have a resolution for the maximum amount of money that could go into any of those reserves. Mr. Saggese questioned the numbers for these reserves. Ms. Niles went over the numbers and agreed to give Mr. Saggese a copy of the liability numbers. Ms. Niles stated that before the tax rate is set in the fall the Board will be given the actual numbers that are going into these reserves. Ms. Niles stated that in order to cover the District the Auditors have suggested that we should have the Board do a motion to fund the maximum. This way if something happens and we are able to fund the maximum that is very nice, if we aren't able to – for example you see the post retirement benefit there is two million dollars – I don't think it is going to be two million dollars but because of a reallocation from short-term to long-term it may be. Last year I had to come back to you for an adjustment – I don't want to do that again.

Mrs. Waldron stated, with reference to the estimate of revenue and expenses, Ms. Niles had previously suggested that the budget committee meet in July after the new members have been selected to review some updated numbers. Ms. Niles responded that it is definitely important, once we have a Finance Committee, that we talk about where we are going, not only for this year-end but it is going to impact next year's budget. We are trying to do multi-year planning on this.
